The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C for quashing of FIR No.144 dated 05.12.2013 under Sections 498-A, 406, 323, 147 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Amloh, District Fatehgarh Sahib and all the subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise dated 06.04.2015 (Annexure P-2).

Brief facts of the case are that the marriage of complainant was solemnized with petitioner No.1 Gurjant Singh, according to rites and rituals. The parents of the complainant had spent amount according to their financial capacity. Due to incompatibility of temperament, both the parties could not live together as husband and wife. The relationship between them became strained and thereafter, the F.I.R was registered against the petitioners.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that keeping in view the peace and harmony of the village and area, the matter has been amicably settled between the parties, vide compromise dated 06.04.2015 (Annexure P-2).

Upon notice, reply by way of affidavit has been filed on behalf of respondent No.2, today in the Court and the same is taken on record.

As per her affidavit, she has joined her matrimonial home and has started living with her husband out of her own sweet will and without any coercion or pressure. She has no objection, if the present FIR registered against the petitioners is quashed.

Consequently, in view of the above-said reply and in view of the judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Dr. Arvind Barsaul etc. Vs. State of Madhya Pradesh and another, 2008(2) RCR (Criminal) 910; Madan Mohan Abbot vs. State of Punjab, 2008(2) RCR (Criminal) 429** and the law laid down by the Full Bench of this Court in the case of **Kulwinder Singh and Ors. vs. State of Punjab and another, 2007(3) RCR (Crl.) 1052**, no useful purpose would be served in prolonging the litigation.

Accordingly, FIR No.144 dated 05.12.2013 under Sections 498-A, 406, 323, 147 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Amloh, District Fatehgarh Sahib and all the subsequent proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed on the basis of compromise dated 06.04.2015 (Annexure P-2).

The present petition stands disposed of.
