This order will dispose of two applications for grant of regular bail, one (CRM-M-15463-2016) filed by Shamsher @ Dhillu and the other (CRM-M-15477-2016) filed by Parveen claiming that they have been in custody w.e.f. 15.07.2015 and 25.09.2015 respectively.

The FIR was registered at the instance of Satyadeep alleging that on 12.07.2015, the complainant along with Rajesh while going on a motorcycle, was waylaid by occupants of two Polo cars. The petitioners along with 15-20 other co-accused raised 'lalkara' and fired in the air on seeing the complainant. Gun shots were fired by non-applicant Mohit and Vikas.

So far as the petitioners are concerned, they have not been attributed any specific injury. Petitioner Parveen was involved in the case on the basis of disclosure statement of the co-accused and supplementary statement of the complainant. He was not even armed with any weapon.

Taking into consideration the period of detention suffered by the petitioners; challan having been presented; the complainant and injured witness having already been examined; chances of tampering with the evidence being remote and co-accused of the petitioners having been granted concession of bail, the petitioners can be granted concession of regular bail.

Both the petitions are allowed. Petitioners are ordered to be released on bail on their furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.
