Learned counsel for the State as well as learned counsel for respondents No. 5 and 6, at the very outset, rightly submit that in view of the nature of controversy involved, coupled with the fact that four elections have already taken place thereafter without there being any objection from anybody, including the petitioners, nothing survives in the present case to be decided at the hands of this Court and the same may be disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous.

Faced with the above, learned counsel for the petitioners also fairly states that let the present writ petition be disposed of in terms of the statements made by learned counsel for the respondents, but liberty may be granted to the petitioners to get the writ petition revived, if necessity arises.

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In view of the abovesaid statements made by learned counsel for the parties, present writ petition is disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous, however, with liberty to the petitioners to get the present writ petition revived within a period of three months, if necessity arises
