1. Whether reporters of local newspapers may be allowed to see judgment?

HARI PAL VERMA, J. (ORAL)

Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.PC is for issuance of a direction to respondents No.1 to 3 to ensure that the petitioner is not harassed at the instance of respondent No.4.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is being harassed at the instance of respondent No.4, however, he has wrongly been typed as respondent No.3 in the Memo of Parties. He further states that respondent No.4 is in the habit of making false complaints against the petitioner on the basis of which the petitioner is being called by the police.

Learned counsel for the petitioner further contends that the

petitioner has already brought these facts to the notice of respondent No.2- Senior Superintendent of Police, Nawanshahr by way of representation dated 9.3.2016 (Annexure P-6), but no action thereon has been taken by the police so far.

Notice of motion to respondents No.1 to 3 only at this stage.

On the asking of this Court, Mr. Gurinderjit Singh, DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of these respondents.

Learned counsel for the petitioner is directed to hand over requisite number of complete copies of the paper book to learned State counsel during course of the day.

Heard.

Without commenting upon the veracity of the contents of claim as put forward by the petitioner in the present petition, the same is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to look into the contents of application (Annexure P-6) and to act in accordance with law.
