Prayer made in the instant petition is for quashing of FIR No.58, dated 14.04.2010, under Section 36(1) of the Punjab Apartment and Property Regulation Act, 1995, registered at Police Station, Lalru, Distt. Mohali.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from Head Constable-Jagtar Singh, submits that in the case in hand, as against 09 witnesses cited by the prosecution, as many as 03 witnesses have been examined and 02 witnesses have been dropped.

Faced with the situation that the trial is at the advance stage, learned counsel for the petitioner does not press the instant

petition, however, with liberty to raise all possible pleas, as available during the course of trial.

Dismissed as not pressed with liberty as aforesaid.
