**JASPAL SINGH, J. (ORAL)**

This is a petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking quashing of FIR No. 109, dated 08.11.2015, under Sections 452, 323, 506, 148 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Mehta, Amritsar Rural (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise (Annexure P-2).

2 Report of learned trial Court has been received, wherein, it has been categorically observed that the parties have entered into compromise voluntarily, out of their free will and without any pressure or coercion. The same appears to be genuine one. Even otherwise, matter involved in these proceedings is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

3. So, in view of circumstances narrated above as well as the observations made in cases reported as *Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and another*; 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 and *Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another (2014) 6 SCC 466*, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for the benefit of the parties and would certainly bring peace and harmony between them.

4. Consequently, instant petition stands allowed and FIR No. 109, dated 08.11.2015, under Sections 452, 323, 506, 148 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Mehta, Amritsar Rural (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising out of the same are quashed qua petitioners.
