HARI PAL VERMA, J.

The petitioner has filed this petition under Section 439 Cr.PC for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.53 dated 22.3.2016 under Sections 307, 382, 365 and 120-B IPC registered at Police Station Civil Lines, Patiala, District Patiala.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has argued that the complainant has registered a false and suspicious FIR and the petitioner has been involved on the basis of some call details. It is not the complainant, rather, the petitioner, who is a victim of immense torture as she was subjected to physical rape. The complainant is an accused and has formulated a concocted story regarding his abduction. The petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case. She has been subjected to gang rape, but the police has not registered a case against the accused.

On the other hand, learned State counsel has argued that the petitioner is an accused and he has referred to certain call details made from the mobile phone of the petitioner.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and seen the call details.

The allegations against the petitioner are serious as she in connivance with co-accused Karam Singh had prepared a plan regarding kidnapping of Krishan Kumar and demanded Rs.10 lacs from him. As per the plan, she had called Krishan Kumar to her house. She had also reported the arrival of Krishan Kumar to her house to co-accused Karam Singh. Therefore, taking into consideration the gravity of offence, this Court does not find any merit in the present petition and the same is, accordingly, dismissed.
