Above-referred petitions are being disposed of by this
common order being connected to each other.

Both these petitions have been filed by the petitioners
seeking quashing of FIR No.88 dated 07.04.2015, registered under
Section 354, 452, 323, 149 IPC, Police Station Kotwali Bathinda,
District Bathinda and all other consequent proceedings arising
therefrom.

Report has been called from the CJM, Bathinda after statements of the parties regarding the compromise were recorded. CJM, Bathinda has reported that the compromise is voluntary and without any pressure or coercion. CJM, Bathinda has also sent copy of the statements of parties along with the report.

Learned State counsel submits that the parties in both the petitions are the persons involved in the FIR.

No useful purpose would be served to keep the FIR pending.

In view of the statements made by the parties and the principles laid down by the Full Bench judgment of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh & Ors. Vs. State of Punjab & Anr. 2007(3) RCR(CrI.) 1052,** approved by Hon'ble the Apex Court in **Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab & Ors. 2012(10) SCC 303,** the instant petitions are allowed and the aforesaid FIR and all the consequent proceedings conducted therein are quashed qua the petitioners.

Needless to say that parties shall remain bound by the terms of compromise.
