The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking quashing of the FIR No. 65 dated 05.05.2014, under Sections 406, 498-A and 506 of the IPC, registered at Police Station Mataur, District SAS Nagar (Annexure P-1) along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of a compromise dated 06.05.2016 (Annexure P-2).

By an order dated 31.05.2016, the trial Court was directed to record the statements of both the parties to its satisfaction regarding the genuineness of the compromise entered into with a direction to the trial Court to send a report along with statements of the parties.

Pursuant to the order passed, the parties appeared before the learned JMIC, Mohali on 30.07.2016, wherein respondent No. 2

submitted that the compromise is without any pressure, threat or undue influence and has been entered into by her own free will. It is further submitted that she would have no objection in case the FIR in question is quashed by the High Court of Punjab & Haryana.

After recording of the said statement, a report has been furnished to this Court wherein, learned JMIC, Mohali has submitted that the compromise effected between the parties appears to be genuine one.

In view of the fact that the matter stands compromised between the parties, no useful purpose would be served in allowing the proceedings to continue under the FIR in question.

Consequently, in view of the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of ***Madan Mohan Abbot vs. State of Punjab 2008(2) RCR (Criminal) 429***, the law laid down by the Full Bench of this Court in the case of ***Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another 2007(3) RCR (Crl.) 1052***, the above noted petition is allowed and FIR No. 65 dated 05.05.2014, under Sections 406, 498-A and 506 of the IPC, registered at Police Station Mataur, District SAS Nagar (Annexure P-1) is quashed along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom qua the petitioner.

The petition stands disposed of accordingly.
