FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 24.12.2015 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Patiala has been received whereby after recording statements of the accused persons namely Hardish Singh @ Disha, Ranjit Singh alias Rana, Subhash Kumar, Ravinder Singh alias Bittu, Surinder Singh and Harbans Singh as well as complainant Tirath Raj, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at

voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, the fact that parties belong to the same very area and the offences for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.151 dated 24.09.2008 registered at Police Station Julkan under Sections 452/324/323/427/148/149/326/201 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
