TEJINDER SINGH DHINDSA, J.

This is the second petition preferred by the petitioner under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.130 dated 16.09.2014, under Sections 419/420/465/467/468/471/120-B IPC, registered at Police Station Dehlon, District Ludhiana City.

Counsel for the petitioner has been heard.

There would be no requirement for this Court to advert to the merits of the case. Concededly, the petitioner had earlier in point of time filed CRM No.M-332 of 2015 before this Court seeking concession of anticipatory bail and the same was dismissed on 10.03.2015 on the basis that even though the petitioner had been granted an opportunity for joining investigation, yet he had not done so. The second factor that has weighed with this Court while passing the order dated 10.03.2015 was that the petitioner was also involved in another FIR of similar nature i.e. FIR No.149/2013.

Insofar as the aforenoticed reasoning which weighed with the Court while declining the first bail petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. and passing the order dated 10.03.2015, there could possibly be no change of circumstance.

Petitioner has been evading the process of law ever since.
Second petition now being preferred after a period of almost 14 months
from the date of dismissal of the previous petition cannot be entertained.

Petition is dismissed.
