This is an application for placing on record the photographs of the petitioners as Annexure P-6.

Application is allowed. Photographs of the petitioners are ordered to be taken on record, as Annexure P-6, subject to all just exceptions.

CRM-M-No. 19583 of 2016

Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for issuance of directions to respondents No.2 to 4 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of respondents No. 5 to 9.

On the asking of the Court, Ms. Shaveta Sanghi, AAG, Haryana, interacted with petitioner No.1-Rukkya, who has informed that she intends to go with petitioner No.2-Sandeep.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the petitioners are major and have solemnized their marriage in accordance with law. However, respondents No. 5 to 9 are not accepting their marriage and are adamant to separate them from each other by resorting to illegal means.

Learned counsel further submits that in view of imminent danger to the life and liberty of the petitioners, they had moved a representation dated 19.05.2016 (Annexure P-5) to respondent No.2 i.e. the Superintendent of Police, Jind, District Jind.

Notice of motion to official respondents No.1 to 4 at this stage.

On the asking of the Court, Mr.Ashish Yadav, Addl. Advocate General, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of these respondents.

Let requisite number of copies of paper book be given to learned counsel for the State during the course of the day.

Without going into the validity of the marriage, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to take appropriate remedial measures, as warranted by law, on the representation dated 19.05.2016 (Annexure P-5) submitted by the petitioners.

In the meantime, necessary order be passed to ensure that no harm is caused to the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of respondents No.5 to 9.
