TEJINDER SINGH DHINDSA, J.

This present petition has been filed Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.65 dated 06.10.2011, under Sections 457/427/506/323/324/326/148/149 IPC, registered at Police Station Tarsikka, District Amritsar.

Counsel for the petitioner has been heard at length.

It has gone uncontroverted that the petitioner absented from trial proceedings without any intimation and without even filing an application seeking personal exemption. Accordingly, on 20.02.2016, his bail order was cancelled and bail bonds forfeited. Thereafter, he was summoned through non-bailable warrants for 19.03.2016 and such warrants were received back unexecuted and it was directed that he be served again through non-bailable warrants for 08.04.2016. Yet again warrants were issued for 06.05.2016.

The petitioner instead of surrendering before the trial Court has preferred an application seeking concession of pre-arrest bail.

The plea taken on behalf of the petitioner is that he is of an advanced age and is suffering from a health ailment.

This Court has even perused the certificates issued by the Doctor pertaining to the medical ailment and as furnished by learned counsel for the petitioner during the course of hearing. Prima facie such documents and certificates appeared to be procured certificates.

Petitioner's conduct has dis-entitled him from the concession of pre-arrest bail.

Petition is dismissed.
