Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of DDR No.26 (in continuance of F.I.R. No.175 dated 18.11.2014 under Sections 323/341/506/34 IPC, PS Maur), under Sections 452, 324, 34 IPC, registered at Police Station Maur, District Bathinda (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 20.05.2016 (Annexure P-2).

This Court vide order dated 04.07.2016 had directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court to get their statements recorded and the learned Magistrate was directed to send its report qua the genuineness of the compromise.

Pursuant to the aforesaid order, parties have appeared before learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Talwandi Sabo and got their

statements recorded. On the basis of the statements so recorded, learned

Magistrate has submitted report dated 26.07.2016 to the effect that the parties have entered into compromise voluntarily and without undue influence, pressure and coercion and the same is genuine.

Though today none has put in appearance on behalf of respondent No.2-complainant, namely, Ashu Garg but no prejudice would be caused to him as he has already made his statement with regard to compromise before learned Magistrate on 19.07.2016. The same is being reproduced as under:-

“Stated that matter has been compromised between accused namely Deepak Kumar, Rakesh Kumar both sons of Diyal Chand, Diyal Chand, Pawan Kumar both sons of Sukhdev Raj, Yogesh Kumar son of Pawan Kumar all R/o Ward no.7 Maur Mandi, Tehsil Maur, Distt. Bathinda and me voluntarily and without any pressure or coercion. DDR No.26 dt. 18.11.2014 u/s 452, 324, 34 IPC, P.S. Maur, Distt. Bathinda is pending between us. The present DDR may kindly be quashed.”

Apart from above, similar statements have been made by respondents No.3 & 4, namely, Rakesh Kumar and Tarsem Kumar respectively, whereby they have shown no objection to the DDR being quashed.

Learned State counsel has not disputed the factum of compromise between the parties.

In view of the above, no useful purpose would be served to continue with the proceedings before the trial Court in the instant case.

Following the principles laid down by the Full Bench judgment of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh and others Versus State of Punjab and another 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052** and approved by the Hon'ble

Supreme Court in **Gian Singh Versus State of Punjab and others (2012)**
10 SCC 303, this petition is allowed and DDR No.26 (in continuance of
F.I.R. No.175 dated 18.11.2014 under Sections 323/341/506/34 IPC, PS
Maur), under Sections 452, 324, 34 IPC, registered at Police Station Maur,
District Bathinda (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising
therefrom are quashed qua the petitioners on the basis of compromise dated
20.05.2016 (Annexure P-2).
