ANITA CHAUDHRY , J(ORAL)

Through the instant petition, the petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.54 dated 17.04.2016, registered under Sections 304-B/34 IPC, Police Station Lalru, Tehsil Dera Bassi, Distt. Mohali.

The deceased was married to the son of the petitioners in November 2015. The unfortunate incident took place in the matrimonial home in April 2016. Blood was oozing from the nose and the ear, but there was no injury in the post-mortem report. The FSL report has been received which shows the presence of Aluminium Phosphide.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the deceased used to remain ill and she was taken to the Doctor. He has placed on record the treatment record. He further states that the petitioners have joined the investigation and the husband is in custody and the challan has been presented against the husband and they were ready to face the trial.

The State counsel has opposed the application and urges that interim bail was granted since the FSL report was taking time and the report has been received and the death was on account of poisoning.

The medical record placed on record by the petitioner is only a urine test report, which does not indicate any treatment. The death had taken place in the matrimonial home within 5 months of the marriage. It has not been shown, at this stage, that the deceased was suffering from any serious disease. There are allegations of demand of dowry. No case for anticipatory bail is made out.

The petition is dismissed.
