There is a request for adjournment on behalf of the complainant. Even on the last date of hearing he sought an adjournment. The husband had been arrested and was released on regular bail.

Counsel for the petitioner says that no recovery was effected from the petitioner. He further says that there are allegations of theft in the FIR and the complainant and her husband are living separately, since 2014.

Learned State counsel on instructions submits that pursuant to the interim order dated 27.06.2016, the petitioner has joined the investigation and has been found innocent.

Since the petitioner has joined the investigation, the petition is allowed and interim order dated 27.06.2016 is hereby made absolute subject to the condition that the petitioner will join the investigation as and when required by the police and will not tamper with evidence or hamper the investigation and will not leave India without permission of the Court and will comply with the conditions contained in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
