INDERJIT SINGH, J.

This petition has been filed under Section Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for brevity, 'Cr.P.C.') for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.174 dated 04.06.2016, registered at Police Station Sector-5, Panchkula, District Panchkula, under Sections 379 and 411 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued in this case.

Mr. Vikramjit Singh, Addl. A. G. Haryana has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that FIR in the present case has been

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registered on the basis of secret information. It was informed to Sub Inspector Surjit Singh that Ravi Kumar son of Suresh Kumar, who was arrested in theft cases, had not got recovered all the ornaments stolen by him and the same are lying with his wife, Tamanna. There are no allegations in the FIR against the present petitioner who is the wife of main accused, Ravi Kumar, who has committed the theft of ornaments etc.

In pursuance of the interim order dated 08.07.2016 passed by this Court, the petitioner has already joined the investigation. She is not required for custodial interrogation.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts of the case in minute details and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case and no useful purpose will be served by sending the petitioner to custody, I find merit in this petition and the same is allowed. The order dated 08.07.2016, granting interim bail to the petitioner, is made absolute. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions of Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.
