This is a petition for anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.53 dated 24.07.2015 under Sections 406/420/120-B of IPC registered at Police Station Division No.6, Jalandhar.

As per the allegations the petitioners had taken money from the complainant and had also given him cheques as security but those cheques have bounced. Thus the petitioners have cheated the complainant. Learned counsel for the petitioners has argued that the entire dispute is a civil dispute at best and even as per the FIR the complainant who is a lawyer was allegedly duped over a period of two years. Learned Addl.AG has accepted these facts but has stated that the recoveries have to be made from the petitioner.

In my opinion the petition deserves to be allowed. Let the

petitioners appear before the investigating officer on 04.08.2016 between 10.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. or on any other date on which their presence is required by the investigating officer and on his appearance the investigating officer shall release him on bail subject to the conditions as envisage under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Petition stands disposed of.
