HARI PAL VERMA, J.(Oral)

Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for issuance of a direction to respondents No.1 to 3 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of respondent No.4.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the petitioners are major and have solemnized their marriage in accordance with law. However, respondent No.4 is not accepting their marriage and is adamant to separate them from each other by resorting to illegal means. Learned counsel further submits that in view of imminent danger to the life and liberty of the petitioners, petitioner No.1 had moved a representation dated 05.07.2016 (Annexure P-4) to the respondent No.2 i.e. Senior Superintendent of Police, Mohali.

Notice of motion to respondents No.1 to 3 only at this stage.

On the asking of this Court, Mr. Sultan Singh Gill, DAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3.

Let requisite number of copies of paper book be given to learned State counsel during the course of the day.

Without going into the validity of the marriage, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondent No.2 to take appropriate remedial measures, as warranted by law, on the representation dated 05.07.2016 (Annexure P-4)) submitted by petitioner No.1.

In the meantime, necessary order be passed to ensure that no harm is caused to the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of respondent No.4.
