This petitioner under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure has been filed for issuance of directions to respondent Nos.3 to 5 to comply the provision of Section 160 Cr.P.C before calling the petitioner to the Police Station as aforesaid respondent Nos.3 to 5 have been unnecessarily calling the petitioners and other family members to the Police Station on a false and frivolous complaint preferred by respondent Nos.6 to 8.

Perused.

It is mentioned in the petition that petitioner No.1 is married to Gurdeep Singh who is running a grocery shop in the village. Out of the wedlock five children were born. It is further mentioned that husband of petitioner No.1 borrowed a sum of ₹6 lacs from respondent No.6-Malkeet Singh for his household needs. In this regard, the husband of petitioner No.1 had issued post dated cheque of ₹6 lacs as a collateral security. However, amount of ₹6 lacs was returned by the husband of the petitioner no.1 to respondent No.6 on 07.04.2015 but the cheque was not returned by respondent No.6 to husband of the petitioner no.1.

From the file, it is not revealed that on which date the alleged loan was taken and the cheque was issued by husband of petitioner No.1. In the absence of any proof qua the loan transaction, no action is warranted in the present petition. It appears that the petitioners have concocted a false story to avoid the payment of cheque amount.

Consequently, the instant petition is devoid of merits and is hereby dismissed.
