Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.116 dated 5.11.2015 under Sections 307, 323, 324, 148, 149, 506 and 120-B IPC (307 IPC deleted later on and offence under Section 336 IPC added) and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, 1959 registered at Police Station Sadar Moga, District Moga.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that vide order dated July 26, 2016 passed by this Court, interim direction was issued to the petitioner to join the investigation on 6.8.2016 and on his joining the investigation, the petitioner was ordered to be released on interim bail subject to the satisfaction of arresting officer. He further submits that in terms of the aforesaid order, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from SI Gurnam Singh,

fairly states that the petitioner has joined the investigation and weapon used in the crime has been recovered.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

Since the petitioner has joined the investigation and conclusion of trial is likely to take sufficient long time, the present petition is allowed and the interim bail granted by this Court to the petitioner vide order dated 26.7.2016 is made absolute.

However, if required, the petitioner shall continue to join investigation as and when required to do so and shall abide by the terms and conditions, as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
