HARI PAL VERMA, J.

Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.46 dated 27.03.2016 under Sections 406/420/120-B IPC and Section 24 of Immigration Act, registered at Police Station Basti Bawa Khel, District Jalandhar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in the case and the complainant was not cheated in any manner by the petitioner. He further states that petitioner is neither a travel agent nor he assured the complainant to send his son and Jaspal Singh to Canada.

On the other hand, learned State counsel has argued that the petitioner has cheated the complainant by dishonestly inducing him to deliver ₹17 lakhs on the pretext of sending him and his nephew-Jaspal

Singh to Canada from Bangkok, but the petitioner neither send them to

Canada nor returned the money.

Heard, learned counsel for the parties.

The allegation against the petitioner is that he has dishonestly induced the complainant-Narinder Kumar and his son Rajan Verma and in this manner, the complainant delivered ₹17 lakhs to the petitioner. Neither the complainant was sent to Canada nor the amount was returned. Therefore, the plea of the petitioner that he has falsely been implicated cannot accepted at this stage as that fact is still under investigation.

Taking into consideration the nature of allegation, this Court does not find any reason to admit the petitioner on anticipatory bail.

Accordingly, the present petition stands dismissed.
