Petitioner has preferred the instant petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C., seeking anticipatory bail in case FIR No.96 dated 19.10.2012, registered at Police Station Kalanaur, District Gurdaspur, under Sections 307, 324, 323, 148 and 149 IPC and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act.

Notice of motion was issued.

Learned State counsel appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

From the record, this Court finds that the petitioner was earlier kept in column No.2 as he was found innocent during investigation. Now he has been summoned on the application under Section 319 Cr.P.C. to face the trial.

In compliance of order dated 29.01.2016, passed by this Court, the petitioner has already appeared before the learned trial

Court and has been released on interim bail, as stated by learned counsel for the petitioner. The petitioner is not required for any custodial interrogation nor anything is to be recovered from him. His presence is required only to face the trial before the learned trial Court. Only simple injury by way of 'dattar' has been attributed to the petitioner. He is not the main accused, who fired upon the complainant.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without commenting on the merits of the case and without discussing the facts of the case in minute details, the instant petition stands accepted and the order dated 29.01.2016, passed by this Court, granting interim bail to the petitioner, is made absolute.
