ANITA CHAUDHRY, J. (ORAL)

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 52 dated 21.06.2016 under Section 306 read with Section 120-B IPC registered at Police Station Sadar Sunam, Tehsil and District Sangrur.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is a married woman and she had shifted to another place and the main accused is Kuldeep Singh whose bail application had been dismissed. The counsel urges that in the first statement given to the police there were no allegations and the family was fully satisfied and statement in this regard was made by Jaspal Singh and the family that Harvinder Kaur had committed suicide as she was under depression after the death of her father and nobody was responsible for that.

Learned counsel for the complainant has opposed the bail application. It was urged that the petitioner had illicit relations with the husband of the deceased and she used to stay in front of their house and had shifted to another house but she was still contacting the husband who was running a grocery shop and was giving goods on credit to the petitioner whereas no such credit was given to any other customer and it would show that he was

showering special favours on her.

The petitioner is a married woman. She was accused of having illicit relations with husband of the deceased. There is an admission by the husband that his wife used to suspect him of illicit relations with the petitioner. The deceased had put end to her life on account of the act of the petitioner and the husband. Considering the above, I am not inclined to grant the discretionary relief of anticipatory bail.

The petition is dismissed.
