AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

The petitioner has preferred the instant petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C., seeking anticipatory bail in case FIR No.133 dated 28.06.2016, registered at Police Station Kotwali, Patiala, under Sections 336, 323, 307 IPC and Sections 25, 27 of the Arms Act (Section 307 IPC added lateron).

On 11.08.2016, this Court passed the following order:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner has argued that a perusal of the FIR Annexure P-2, MLR Annexure P-5 and the respective antecedents of both the parties clearly make out a case for anticipatory bail.

Learned Addl. A.G., Punjab seeks a short adjournment to address these issues.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that he has no objection but in that event the petitioner should be protected.

Adjourned to 20.10.2016.

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Meanwhile, in the event of arrest, the petitioner be released on interim bail by the Investigating Officer to his satisfaction.”

Learned State counsel, on instructions from Sub Inspector Sukhdeep Singh, states that as the matter has been settled, the cancellation report has been filed.

Resultantly, the interim order dated 11.08.2016 is made absolute subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Petition stands allowed.
