INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.26 dated 30.04.2010, registered at Police Station City-II, Abohar, District Fazilka, under Sections 324, 323 and 34 IPC.

Notice of motion was issued in this case. Learned State counsel put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that the petitioner absented from the court proceedings in the year 2011 and then he was declared proclaimed offender.

Learned counsel for the petitioner stated that co-accused has been acquitted by the trial Court.

Mere acquittal of co-accused is no ground for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner. The petitioner absented from the court proceedings about five years back and was ultimately declared proclaimed offender.

No ground for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made out.
