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M.M.S. BEDI, J.

Petitioner through instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeks a direction to S.P., Kaithal to conduct proper investigation in the complaint filed by him with regard to fraud having been committed upon him by the private respondents including respondent No.6 Ramanpreet Kaur by concealing her state of health.

Allegations have been levelled that after the marriage, respondent No.6 showed abnormal behaviour on account of which she was taken on July 20, 2016 by her parents. He has referred to treatment slips from Mental Health Care to show that respondent No.6 had been getting treatment from Ashadeep Clinic. On the basis of the photocopies of the

medical prescriptions, petitioner claims that a fraud has been played upon him.

I have considered the contentions of learned counsel for the petitioner and I am of the opinion that the allegations levelled by the petitioner in the present petition and the representation submitted to S.P., Kaithal, annexure P-5 suggest that no cognizable offence is made out. The petitioner has got a remedy to challenge the relationship. Merely on the allegation that respondent No.6 has been getting treatment from a neurosurgeon will not be sufficient enough to constitute a cognizable offence. No ground is made out for issuing a direction for registration of the case.

Petition is dismissed without prejudice to the rights of the petitioner to avail any other alternative remedy available to him by establishing the allegations, in accordance with law.
