JASPAL SINGH, J.

Instant petition has been preferred under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking quashing of FIR No.07, dated 20.01.2014, under Sections 326, 324, 323 and 34 IPC, Police Station Sadar, District Kapurthala (Annexure P-1), along with all subsequent proceedings arising out of the same, on the basis of compromise.

2. In compliance of order dated September 29, 2016, report of Id. Judicial Magistrate has been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that the compromise has been made by the parties voluntarily, without any threat, pressure or coercion and appears to be a genuine

compromise so as to end the litigation. Even otherwise, the matter involved

is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest. Compromise is the soul of justice, which not only enhances the social amity, harmony and peace but also reduces friction and discord.

5. So, in view of above circumstances and in view of the pronouncement captioned as “**Kulwinder Singh & others v. State of Punjab & others; 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052**, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for their benefit and will bring peace and harmony between them.

6. Consequently, the instant petition stands allowed, FIR No.07, dated 20.01.2014, under Sections 326, 324, 323 and 34 IPC, Police Station Sadar, District Kapurthala and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom are quashed qua the petitioners.
