The petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.02, dated 5.1.2016, registered under Section 420 of the IPC, at Police Station Sardulgarh, District Mansa.

Counsel for the petitioner has argued that the previous petition was dismissed by order dated 1.6.2016 on the premise that having taken bail by stating that he would give his sample signatures, the petitioner deliberately disguised his handwriting. He has further argued

that what was mentioned in the FSL report was that the petitioner had deliberately not only given his genuine signatures but that number of signatures which had been given were too few to permit actual comparison. As per him, the petitioner would have no objection in giving as many as signatures as are required for the purpose.

Learned Addl. AG Punjab, on instructions from HC Harinder Singh, has accepted these factual assertions.

In the circumstances, the petitioner is directed to appear before the Ilaqa Magistrate on 14.9.2016 and give 60 sample signatures. After the petitioner gives his sample signatures, he shall be released on anticipatory bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating Officer, subject to the compliance of the provisions of Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.

This petition stands disposed of.
