In FIR No.0155 dated 14.07.2016 registered under Section 307 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Sections 25/27/59 of Arms Act, at Police Station Kotwali Faridkot, District Faridkot, the petitioner is being prosecuted.

Mr. Vinay Kumar Gupta-learned counsel for the complainant states that now a compromise has been arrived at between the parties and the same is annexed as Annexure P-2. I have perused the affidavit of complainant-Annexure P-2. Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner would not indulge in such type of offence of any other type of offence in future.

This Court vide order dated August 10, 2016 had directed the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate to record the statements of the parties in view

of the compromise and verify that whether the same is genuine or not.

Now, there is a report received from Chief Judicial Magistrate, Faridkot, showing that the statements of the parties have been recorded and compromise that is arrived at between the parties with the intervention of the respectable persons is genuine and without any pressure, coercion or undue influence.

Looking to the nature of the offences registered in FIR and terms of the compromise deed, I think, parties should be allowed to compound/compromise the offences in order that they live in peace and harmony.

In that view of the matter, FIR No.0155 dated 14.07.2016 registered under Section 307 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Sections 25/27/59 of Arms Act, at Police Station Kotwali Faridkot, District Faridkot, is quashed by way of compounding/compromise along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom.
