**Main Case**

This petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of FIR No.34 dated 08.02.2012, registered under Sections 419, 511, 201 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code (for short 'the IPC'); Section 5 of the Emblems and Names (Prevention of Improper Use) Act; and Sections 66-A & 66-D of the Information and Technology Act, at Police Station Sector 19, Chandigarh and all consequential

proceedings arising therefrom.

The learned counsel for the parties state that matter stands amicably resolved. Affidavits of the petitioners have been filed in the Court, same are taken on record as Mark 'A' to Mark 'G', admitting the factum of settlement and have further resolved not to pursue any litigation i.e. to be filed or pending against the complainant/respondent No.2. The learned counsel for respondent No.2 undertakes that he shall forthwith withdraw the complaint filed by him.

Heard.

Hence, in view of the consensus reached between the parties, this Court feels that no useful purpose would be served in keeping the proceedings alive when the resolution of the parties has made the thing from bitter to better. The settlement reached between the parties is in the interest of justice and accordingly, accepted.

In view of the above, the present petition is allowed. FIR No.34 dated 08.02.2012, registered under Sections 419, 511, 201 and 120-B IPC; Section 5 of the Emblems and Names (Prevention of Improper Use) Act; and Sections 66-A & 66-D of the Information and Technology Act, at Police Station Sector 19, Chandigarh and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed qua the present petitioners.
