1. Whether Reporters of local papers may be allowed to see the judgment?
2. To be referred to the Reporters or not?
3. Whether the judgment should be reported in the Digest?

JASPAL SINGH, J (Oral)

This is a petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for issuance of directions to respondents No. 1 and 2 to constitute special investigation team (SIT) of some senior police officials for investigation in case FIR No. 99, dated 28.03.2015, under Sections 306 and 511 IPC, Police Station Civil Lines, Amritsar City, Punjab.

2. While issuing notice of motion, following order was passed by this Court on August 17, 2015:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioners has confined his arguments that the Special Investigating Team has not been constituted after the retirement of respondent No.4 from the Police Department.

Notice of motion to this extent to respondents No. 1 to 3 only, at this stage for 19.11.2015.”

3. Today, at the very outset of the arguments, it has emerged that after the retirement of respondent No.4-Harjit Singh Brar, Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police (Special), Amritsar, a new team has been constituted and the investigation has been conducted by the newly formed SIT. Ultimately, it came to the conclusion that no case is made out and recommended the case by making untraced report. Untraced report has also been submitted before the Id. Jurisdictional Magistrate on 01.10.2015.

In view of the aforesaid facts, instant petition has rendered infructuous. However, the petitioners would be at liberty to plead or present their case before the concerned court.
