JASPAL SINGH, J (ORAL)

This is a petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for issuance of directions to respondents No.2 and 3 to take appropriate action as per law against respondent No.4, owner of brick kiln who is alleged to have given beatings to the petitioners and also tried to commit rape upon petitioner No.2, wife of petitioner No.1.

2. In response to notice, learned State counsel filed a detailed reply in shape of an affidavit of Rajesh Kumar, Deputy Superintendent of Police,

Jagadhri on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3 disclosing that on the basis of

complaint lodged by the petitioner with the police a DDR No. 9-A dated July 15, 2014 was recorded. Thereafter, a deep and thorough inquiry was conducted, associating the petitioner as well as some other persons and Inquiry Officer came to the conclusion that the allegations levelled by petitioner No.1 are absolutely wrong and frivolous and further that no offence is made out of against any of persons. It has further been observed that if the petitioner No.1 sustained any injury that might has been suffered by him himself in an inebriated condition. Since, the allegations unfolded by the petitioners have already found to be false and inquiry has already been conducted, instant petition has become infructuous and as such the same is dismissed.
