Main Case

Present petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C seeking the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in case F.I.R. No.51 dated 5.5.2015 under section 420 I.P.C, registered at Police Station, Ajnala, District Amritsar (Rural).

Counsel appearing for the petitioners has placed reliance upon compromise deed dated 26.2.2016 (Annexure A-1) and would submit that the dispute which was essentially civil in nature has been amicably settled.

Learned State counsel upon instructions from ASI Sukhjinder Singh would also apprise the Court that statement of the complainant has been recorded on 26.2.2016 itself and as per which compromise has been arrived at between the parties.

Under such circumstances, custodial interrogation of the petitioners, as such, would not be warranted. Accordingly, the present

petition is allowed subject to the following conditions as envisaged under section 438 (2) Cr.P.C:-

(i) that the petitioners shall make themselves available for interrogation before investigating officer as and when required;

(ii) that the petitioners shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade them from disclosing such facts to the court or to any police officer;

(iii) that the petitioners shall not leave India without the prior permission of the Court.

Petition disposed of.
