This order shall dispose of CRM-M-28279-2016, filed by
petitioner-Deepak @ Deepa and CRM-M-28282-2016, filed by petitioner-
Amritpal Singh @ Lali, under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail
in case FIR No.103 dated 18.09.2015, registered at Police Station Jaitu,

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Tehsil Jaitu, District Faridkot, under Sections 307, 323, 148 and 149 IPC and Section 325 IPC (added later on).

Notice of motion has been issued in both these petitions.

Ms. Shivali, AAG, Punjab has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that FIR in the present case has been registered at the instance of Lakha Ram son of Balwinder Singh. As per the prosecution version, injury dangerous to life has been given by Preet Singh alias Ganna/non-petitioner. The grievous injuries are attributed to Gurdeep Singh @ Baggi. The present petitioners are stated to be armed with iron rods and simple injuries are attributed to them on the left leg of the complainant.

The petitioners have been in custody since 16.11.2015. They are not required for interrogation or investigation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Therefore, keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the cases, these criminal miscellaneous petitions are allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be

released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of

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₹40,000/- each with one surety each in the like amount to the satisfaction of
the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
