FATEH DEEP SINGH, J.

Report dated 10.02.2016 sent by learned Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class Gurdaspur has been received, whereby, after recording statements of petitioners-accused Jitesh Dogra @ Mani, Kuldeep Singh @ Gandhi, Munish Salaria @ Laddi, Mandeep Singh @ Chhotu and Bachittar Singh @ Vika as well as of complainant Bhawani Singh it has been informed that the parties have effected a compromise voluntarily on their free will and accord without any pressure.

A perusal of the medical record also reflects that though there is a single injury on the head of the complainant but the same apparently is only superficial without any injury to the underlying vital parts and even the report does not depicts that there are other injuries on the body of the injured which could have any danger to the life, and thus, applicability of Section 307 IPC is a debatable issue as

even earlier the injury was only termed as grievous.

Keeping in view the same and in view of the the that that the parties have effected a compromise which will go a long way to sort out the differences between them and to bring about harmony in view of law laid down in **Gian Singh vs. State of Punjab and another 2012(4) RCR Criminal 543** and **Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and another 2007(3) RCR Criminal 1052**, FIR No.179 dated 26.09.2014 under Sections 307, 326, 323, 324, 341, 148, 149 IPC Police Station, Dinanagar District Gurdaspur and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed qua the present petitioners.

Petition stands disposed off.
