The petitioner along with 7/8 other co-accused had allegedly trespassed in the house of complainant Sukhpal Kaur and attacked her and her family members armed with various weapons resulting in death of Angrej Singh.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that Angrej Singh has died after eight months but it appears that death is indirect result of injury received by him.

The chance of tampering with the evidence is not ruled out at this stage.

Without expression of any opinion on merits of the case, it is felt that eye witness besides seven more witnesses, having not yet been examined, it will be expedient, in the interest of justice, to dispose of this petition with a direction that the trial Court shall make earnest endeavour to

record the statements of all the prosecution witnesses within a period of five months from today. The prosecution agency will be responsible to produce the witnesses on the short dates given by the trial Court. In case, the trial is not concluded within a period of six months, the petitioner would be entitled to approach this Court for grant of bail.
