This common order will dispose of both the petitions arising out of the same FIR.

Heard learned counsel for the rival parties.

In FIR No.33 dated 11.03.2010 registered under Sections 323, 324, 336, 506, 148, 149 and 427 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Sections 25(1)/25(54)/59 of Arms Act, at Police Station Majitha District Amritsar, Punjab, the petitioners are being prosecuted.

Learned counsel for both the parties have stated that

compromise has been arrived at between the parties. This Court vide order dated August 29, 2016 had directed the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate to record the statements of the parties in view of the compromise and verify that whether the same is genuine or not.

Now, there is a report received from Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Amritsar, showing that the statements of the parties have been recorded and compromise that is arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure, coercion or undue influence.

Looking to the nature of the offences registered in the FIR and terms of the compromise deed, I think, parties should be allowed to compound/compromise the offences in order that they live in peace and harmony.

In that view of the matter, FIR No.33 dated 11.03.2010 registered under Sections 323, 324, 336, 506, 148, 149 and 427 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and Sections 25(1)/25(54)/59 of Arms Act, at Police Station Majitha District Amritsar, Punjab, is quashed by way of compounding/compromise along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom.
