Notice of motion to official respondents.

On the asking of Court, Mr. Deepak Sabharwal, Addl.
Advocate General, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of the said
respondents. A copy of the paper book be handed over to him.

At this stage parents of the girl, Sewa Singh and Anita
respondents No.4 and 5 respectively have put in appearance on their
own along with their counsel Mr.Randeep S. Dhull, Advocate and have
sought to oppose the relationship of the petitioners on the grounds that it
is not acceptable to them.

Keeping in view as is admitted by both the sides that both
the petitioners are major and have solemnized marriage, thus it becomes
imperative for this Court to extent protection to their lives and personal
liberty by virtue of Article 21 of the Constitution of India.

In view of the same, official respondents are directed to ensure due protection to the lives and personal liberty of the petitioners. In case any eventuality of threat is brought to the notice of the police by the petitioners, they shall take speedy action in accordance with law.

At this stage, it has been brought to the notice of this Court by learned counsel for the petitioners that a huge crowd has gathered outside the Court and has sought prayer for sending the petitioners to Protection Home at Chandigarh. In the light of the same and as is pointed out a huge crowd having been gathered, it would not be safe for the petitioners to leave the Court premises in the light of which, Senior Superintendent of Police, Chandigarh and SHO, Police Station Sector 3, Chandigarh are directed to immediately provide protection to the couple to escort them to the Protection Home, Chandigarh.

The petition stands disposed off accordingly.
