JASPAL SINGH, J.

This petition has been preferred under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of FIR No. 307, dated 14.06.2015, under Sections 452, 382, 120-B IPC and under Section 25 of the Arms Act, registered at Police Station Sector 34, Chandigarh on the basis of compromise.

2. In compliance of order dated August 26, 2015, report of Id. Judicial Magistrate has been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that compromise between the parties is genuine and out of the free will of the parties without any pressure,

coercion or undue pressure from any corner. Even otherwise, matter involved is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

3. In view of the above I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for their benefit and will bring peace and harmony between them.

4. Consequently, instant petition stands allowed and FIR No. 307, dated 14.06.2015, under Sections 452, 382, 120-B IPC and under Section 25 of the Arms Act, registered at Police Station Sector 34, Chandigarh and all other subsequent proceedings arising therefrom are quashed qua the petitioner.
