Application is allowed, as prayed for.

Main Petition

Instant petition has been preferred by Mohinder Singh under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking summoning of the investigation-cum-status report in FIR No. 24 of 2010 dated March 02, 2010 under Section 302, 201 and 34 IPC registered at Railway Police Station, Rohtak District GRP Ambala Cantt from

the Crime Branch, Haryana Police and further handing over the same to the CBI or any other independent agency of the Central Government.

2. In response to notice of motion a written statement on behalf of respondents No.1 to 5 and 9 has been furnished and also the status report on behalf of respondents No. 1 to 6 and 9 was submitted. A perusal of the status report transpires that initially investigation of the afore-mentioned FIR was conducted by Government Railway Police, Rohtak. However, on the request of complainant the investigation of this case was transferred to State Crime Branch, Rohtak and Bhiwani who after thorough investigation came to the conclusion that it is a case of suicide and not of murder. The dead body of Sanjeev was also subjected to autopsy by a Board of Doctors and the viscera was sent to FSL, Madhuban. The FSL vide its report Annexure R-1 opined that Aluminium Phosphate was detected in the organs of the deceased. The Board of Doctors also opined that the cause of death of Sanjeev was due to poison i.e. Aluminium Phosphate.

3. Here, it would be pertinent to mention that investigation of this case was not only conducted by local staff of GRP, Rohtak but also by State Crime Branch, Rohtak and Bhiwani and nothing has emerged from the investigation that Sanjeev had been murdered. Accordingly, the case was submitted to the concerned court as untraced.

4. In view of status report filed by official respondents, no further action is required. As such, the instant petition stands dismissed.
