This order shall dispose of the above mentioned two petitions.

Both these petitions have been filed for grant of anticipatory

bail to the petitioner(s) under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case FIR No.114, dated

11.08.2016 registered under Sections 420/467/468/471/120-B IPC at Police

Station Division B, Police Commissionerate, Amritsar. For the sake of convenience the facts are being taken from CRM-M-30276-2016.

Today learned counsel for the petitioners state that a sum of Rs.1,19,500/- has been transferred to the account of the complainant and another amount of Rs.49,000/- has been handed over by way of draft in favour of the complainant.

Learned counsel for the complainant vehemently opposes the bail application and states that the complainant is not willing to accept this amount because for the past 4 months the petitioner know that the marriage of the daughter of the complainant is fixed for 25.12.2016 and rather even today there is a function in the house of the complainant and the complainant is attending the Court and despite having promised so many occasions the petitioners have not fulfilled their solemn undertaking before this Court.

Learned counsel for the petitioners state that it is only because of a down turn in the business that the petitioners have not been able to make the payment and undertakes to make the remaining payment of Rs.3,30,000/- odd within one month.

Despite the opposition of learned counsel for the complainant and the learned Deputy Advocate General, without going into the merits of the case, I deem it appropriate to dispose of these petitions with a direction that in case the petitioners pay the amount of Rs.3,30,000/- odd to the complainant on or before 22.02.2017 the Investigating Officer shall confirm their bail, failing which, this petition would be deemed to be dismissed.

Ordered accordingly.

Since the main cases have been decided, the pending criminal miscellaneous applications, if any, also stands disposed of.
