This petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of Rapat No.15 dated 03.09.2015, registered under Sections 323, 324, 326, 341 and 148 of the Indian Penal Code (for short 'IPC') read with Section 149 IPC, at Police Station Jandiala Guru, Amritsar, in FIR No.189 dated 12.08.2015 and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise arrived at between the parties.

On 30.08.2016, this Court had passed the following order:-

“Notice of motion.

Mr. Vivek Salathia, Advocate appears on behalf of respondent Nos.2 and 3.

At the asking of the Court, Ms. Harsimrat Rai, DAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State. A complete copy of the paper book has been furnished to the

learned State counsel, in the Court.

Learned counsel for respondent Nos.2 and3 admits the factum of compromise.

Accordingly, the private parties are directed to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court on 09.09.2016 for recording their statements with regard to compromise/settlement. Illaqa Magistrate/Trial Court is directed to submit a report on or before the next date of hearing containing the following information :-

- 1. Number of persons arrayed as accused in FIR.*
- 2. Whether any accused is proclaimed offender.*
- 3. Whether the compromise is genuine, voluntary and without any coercion or undue influence.*

A copy of the report be also sent through fax to the Registrar Judicial of this Court.

Adjourned to 24.09.2016.”

As per the report of learned Judicial Magistrate First Class, Amritsar, none of the parties put in appearance before the trial Court for recording their statements with regard to compromise.

It appears that parties have lost interest in the matter.

In these circumstances, the instant petition is dismissed.
