The prayer in the present petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. is for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.90 dated 13.07.2015, under Sections 307, 148, 149 of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 25/27/54/59 of the Arms Act, registered with Police Station Bulloval, District Hoshiarpur (**Annexure P-1**).

As per the allegations, the injured/complainant-Harpreet Singh was attacked by the accused party comprising of the main accused, namely, Ranjit Singh, Charanjit Singh @ Goggi, Dupinder Singh (present petitioner), Tanvir Singh, Narender Nehru and Jaswant Singh Gandhi.

The accused Ranjit Singh is alleged to have fired three shots at the complainant, resulting into serious injuries.

The genesis of the quarrel is a prior dispute between the complainant-Harpreet Singh and Ranjeet Singh (father of the present petitioner).

It is contended that the petitioner is 19 years old engineering student and has been attributed no injury apart from the fact that he was empty handed.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner further submits that the petitioner is in custody since 25.07.2015 and after completion of the investigation even the charges have been framed.

Learned State Counsel, assisted by Inspector Vikramjeet, does not dispute regarding the custody period as well as the framing of charges.

Without commenting on the merits of the case, keeping in view the custody period and the facts as noticed above, this Court finds that petitioner/accused-Dupinder Singh deserves the concession of regular bail and as such he is ordered to be released on bail to the satisfaction of CJM/Duty Magistrate concerned.

Disposed of.
