Petitioner has preferred the instant petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C., for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.31 dated 18.02.2016, registered at Police Station Shimlapuri, Ludhiana, under Section 420, 120-B IPC.

As per the allegations, the petitioner had taken a sum of Rs.25,00,000/- from the complainant with the promise that she would give him a return of 1% per month and also take him to a free trip to Thailand every month. That promise was not fulfilled. The petitioner also gave cheques which were bounced.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has argued that the petitioner has been in custody for about 06 months and this is a case which is at best one of civil liability and as regards the cheques issued by the petitioner, the complainant has already filed a complaint under Section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act.

Criminal Misc.No.M-30674 of 2016 (O&M)

The factum of filing complaint under Section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act has been accepted.

Therefore, without commenting on the merits of the case, I deem it appropriate to release the petitioner on regular bail to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court/Duty Magistrate.

Ordered accordingly.

Petition stands allowed.
