1. Whether Reporters of local papers may be allowed to see the judgment?

JASPAL SINGH, J.

Instant petition has been preferred under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking quashing of FIR No.14, dated 02.02.2015, under Sections 420, 467, 468 and 471 IPC, Police Station City Sri Muktsar Sahib, District Sri Muktsar Sahib (Annexure P-1) as well as all the subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise dated 16.08.2015 (Annexure P-2).

2. Report of learned Judicial Magistrate has been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that compromise has

been effected between complainant Gaurav Saluja, Shavinder Vohra and accused Manish Nagpal, Ramesh Chander Nagpal and Seema Nagpal. The statements made before the court appear to be made voluntarily and without any pressure. Even otherwise, the matter involved is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

3. So, in view of above circumstances and in view of the pronouncements captioned as “**Kulwinder Singh & others v. State of Punjab & others**”; 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 and “**Madan Mohan Abbot vs. State of Punjab**”, 2008(2) RCR (Criminal) 429, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for their benefit and will bring peace and harmony between them.

4. Consequently, the instant petition stands allowed and FIR No.14, dated 02.02.2015, under Sections 420, 467, 468 and 471 IPC, Police Station City Sri Muktsar Sahib, District Sri Muktsar Sahib and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom are quashed qua the petitioners.
