Prayer in this petition, filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C., is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner-Harkrishan Singh @ Blacky, who has been booked for having committed the offences punishable under Sections 307, 148, 149 of the Indian Penal Code (Section 302, IPC added later on) and Sections 25-54-59 of the Arms Act, in a case arising out of FIR No.207 dated 25.05.2015, registered at Police Station A-Division, District Amritsar.

As per the allegations, on 25.05.2015 at about 9:00 AM, complainant-Amolakjit Singh was present in the house of his uncle-Gurdev Singh, petitioner-accused Harkrishan Singh @ Blacky was accompanying the other co-accused/non-applicants, who were armed with *Rifle, 32 bore revolver, Dagger* etc., started hurling abuses to the complainant-Amolakjit Singh and raising lalkaras. On being asked by Gurdev Singh not to behave in such an uncivilized manner, co-accused Tinku and Pintu fired from their respective weapons upon Gurdev Singh with an intention to kill him.

The role attributed to the petitioner is of accompanying the co-accused, who were armed with deadly weapons.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and his custodial interrogation is no longer required.

Learned State Counsel, assisted by ASI Jeewan Singh, agrees that the petitioner has joined the investigation and his custodial interrogation is no longer required. He further submits that the challan stands presented.

In view of the above, interim protection/pre-arrest bail granted by this Court, vide order dated 28.09.2015, is made absolute.

Disposed of.
