HARI PAL VERMA, J.

Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.PC is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.50 dated 27.8.2016 under Sections 307/342/506/323/148/149 IPC and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959 registered at Police Station Jhunir, District Mansa.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has contended that name of the petitioner has falsely been dragged in the FIR. He was not involved in the case in any manner and no injury was attributed to him. The allegation against the petitioner is that he was having pistol, but no shot has been fired from said pistol. The co-accused, namely, Balkar Singh alias Kala, Mela Singh, Gurpreet Singh alias Thela and Gora have already been arrested.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner.

The allegation against the petitioner is that Indica car of black colour belongs to him and he along with other co-accused was found present

at the scene of occurrence. The petitioner and his co-accused Gora Singh were armed with country-made pistols. They locked the complainant and his son Karam Singh in the liquor vend and threatened them that if they came out, they (accused party) would shoot them (complainant party). Jagtar Singh was injured in the case and while he was under treatment, he was also referred to PGIMER, Chandigarh.

Thus, taking into consideration the participation of the petitioner in the crime, this Court does not find any reason to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner and the present petition is, accordingly, dismissed.
