Heard learned counsel for the rival parties.

In FIR No.59 dated 29.06.2015, registered under Sections 323, 324 and 34 of Indian Penal Code, 1860, at Police Station Kabarwala, District Sri Muktsar Sahib, the petitioners are being prosecuted.

In the meanwhile, compromise has been arrived at between the parties. This Court had made an order dated September 19, 2016 directing the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate to record the statements of the parties in view of the compromise. Pursuant to the same, now there is a report received from District & Sessions Judge, Sri Muktsar Sahib, coupled with the documents, recording of statements of the parties etc.

Perusal of the same shows that the compromise that has arrived

at between the parties with intervention of the respectable persons is genuine and without and pressure, coercion or undue influence.

Looking to the nature of the offence(s) registered in the FIR and terms of compromise (Annexure P-2), I think, compounding/compromise should be allowed.

Hence, FIR No.59 dated 29.06.2015, registered under Sections 323, 324 and 34 of Indian Penal Code, 1860, at Police Station Kabarwala, District Sri Muktsar Sahib, is quashed along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom.
