Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.PC is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.348 dated 31.8.2016 under Section 21-B of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 (for short, the NDPS Act) registered at Police Station Bhuna, District Fatehabad.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has argued that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the cases. He was earlier a police informer and when he stopped divulging any information to the police, he has been illegally roped in the present case as well as other cases. Everytime when the petitioner gets interim bail, a fresh case is registered against him. Even the recovery effected from the petitioner is non-commercial.

On the other hand, learned State counsel, on instructions from

ASI Bahadur Singh, has submitted that as many as 8 cases are registered against the petitioner and out of these cases, 7 cases are registered under the NDPS Act.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

Taking into consideration the allegations levelled against the petitioner coupled with the fact that besides this case, he is accused in as many as 7 other cases, it cannot be presumed that the cases registered against the petitioner are planted one. Therefore, this Court does not find any merit in the present petition and the same is, accordingly, dismissed.
